

Cavalcade of Magic 2023

Greetings Magi,

2023 is here! I hope it finds you doing well. I also hope you are making plans to attend the Cavalcade of Magic 2023! It will take place March 24-25th at the Inn of the Ozarks in Eureka Springs. We will meet for an auction Thursday the 23rd at about 8pm. We are finishing up the schedule and are looking forward to seeing everyone and learning,

and experiencing magic and illusions. So plan to be there early enough to get your items ready and look over what others have to sell at the auction.

Be sure and take advantage of the Best Western Inn of the Ozarks discounts for the Cavalcade. Make your room reservations by January 31 to get them. \$89 for 1 King or 2 Queen beds, and \$145 for Suites. Prices are good through February 23rd, but you must call the Inn of the Ozarks directly at 479-253-9768 and mention that you are with the magicians group.

Preregistration and entry for next year's free registration can be made on PayPal to ibmring75@att.net. This year, please add \$5 to your amount to cover the new fees that are being charged. Or you can send a check by mail to Clyde Hayre at 10813 Hunter Point Rd, Fort Smith, AR 72903. There is no extra fee for checks. You can still pay at the door with cash or check, you just don't get in the drawing.

Also, we have made a couple of changes to registration fees for the first time in 40 years! The fee is still \$75 for a magician for the convention. But we have added a single day fee of \$50 for those who can only make one day. Also, we have raised the magician plus family fee to \$100 per family. If only the magician is attending events and family is only attending the evening shows, you still pay the magician only rate. The evening shows are still free! If that doesn't make sense, use your favorite method to contact me or one of the committee members for clarification. We have resisted doing this for some time, but can't put it off any longer.

We have a great lineup of lectures for you this year and the shows are filling up as well. If you would like to perform on one of the evening shows or the matinee, please let me know by reply to this email. Don't forget you can also participate in the Open Mic session on Friday afternoon.

Happy New Year

Wow it is hard to believe that it is 2023, time marches on. Do you make New Year's resolutions? As I write this, we are past the first half-month of the New Year. Most people that have made resolutions have already broken them (You know work out every day, eat healthy, and don't get annoyed with "that" person I work with. The type of resolutions that are almost impossible to keep. I go to a gym, and I usually hate the month of January as it is really busy. My challenge to you, as it concerns Magic, is not to make a resolution that can be easily broken but rather to make a SMART goal. SMART is an acronym for a goal that is Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant and Time-Bound. So here are some examples of a couple of my Magic goals this year.

- 1. Perform a specific card routine that I found in ("My Best" a magic book that I have) at the Cavalcade of Magic in Eureka Springs. If you want to see it you have to be there. Notice that it is specific, measurable, attainable, relevant, and Time-bound. (Notice I didn't say I would back-palm a half a deck of cards at the Cavalcade (while specific and measurable for me it is not attainable). My goal is relevant, this year I am also going to build a cigar -box guitar but that is not relevant to my Magic Goal. My goal is Time-Bound it is not open ended that some day I would learn and work on this routine. The day is approaching so I better learn it, practice it or fall on my face.
- 2. Work on a cups and balls routine. While I am still in the exploratory stage of this goal (Have to decide on a routine) I am planning to perform it at the Cavalcade in 2024. I liked Suzanne's routine and purchased her routine but I also like a routine that I have read in Tommy Copper's short book so decisions, decisions.

So, for 2023 what SMART goals will you make for your Magic?

Little Rock Magic Ring 29 did not have a meeting this month as we enjoyed our annual Christmas Magic Show on January 14th. What a show it was! Many thanks go out to the two close up magicians, Bob Bullock and Chris Thompson for entertaining guests as they waited for the show to begin. Of course, we cannot forget the six magicians who had our audience laughing and mesmerized, Al Henager, Blayk Puckett, Derrick Rose, Jimmy Rhodes, Scott Davis and Joey Williams. These fine entertainers gave us all a fantastic show and as a result we will have some of our new guests returning for next year.

In brief, the show kicked off with a bang as Master of Ceremonies Marty Haughn got the audience worked up with some entertaining music. Sporting orange framed sunglasses and a flashing hat Marty headed into the audience and started dancing with Molly Jones.

First on board was the dapper looking Al Henager. Al brought a sense of class and elegance demonstrating complete control over his routine. Al's script is his original writing which had the audience captivated throughout his telling of a story from his childhood called "Mystery of the Guitar Mansion", a version of "Copentro", while coins magically moved from one location to another. It seemed that every time a bell was rung one of his coins had left and appeared in a silk covered glass.

Al was followed by Blayk Puckett who started with a unique newspaper tear then moved into a "High Gravity" sort of juggling or spinning or try not to spill the milk routine. Blayk had the audience in a frenzy of entertainment and excitement. His skill and talent seems limitless for every show I see him in.

Derrick Rose was introduced next and began talking about, of all things, a "Blind Date". Several questions were asked of an audience member regarding a month, day and through a chosen name from cards, her date's name. Everything stated ended up being on the prediction sheet pulled from a large envelope he had on stage.

We took a short fifteen minute break then moved right into the transferring of Rabbit E. Lee to yet another home. The previous guardian was Joel Nicholson who, by tradition, added a COVID home test to the traveling rabbit. The lucky guardian this year was Dan Hecke. I wonder what will be added for next year.

The second half of the show was kicked off with Jimmy Rhodes. Jimmy always seems to have a lot of fun while on stage and includes an audience member. This time was no different as he needed some money. A young volunteer came up with three dollars which started the comedic run of jokes and fun.

All the way from Hot Springs, Scott Davis spun the audience up once again looking for a woman to volunteer her wedding ring. She obliged and then a young volunteer came up to assist in not only losing the ring but finding it coming from a bubble gum machine.

Our closing act was from Joey Williams. He provided a lengthy introduction which explained not only the music but a short story behind the performance. Joey has been known to make a mess on stage and was banned from repeating...the ban was lifted and a snow storm hit the stage. Great music and great finish for the show. It was clear the audience had a great time and was highly entertained thanks to our performers.

Blast from the Past

This month's report looks back just 10 years to the January, 2013 meeting of the Ring. The President at that time was Jon Bucher and the Secretary was Robert (Bob) White. The Ring met monthly at Shuffeld Auditorium in Little Rock.

Ring 29 gets to celebrate Christmas twice a year. In December we have our club party and then in January, instead of our regular meeting, we put on our annual public show, which has traditionally been called our Christmas party show.

The gala event was held again this year at the Jacksonville, Arkansas community center. Included in the \$10 price of admission was dinner. The bill of fare was barbecue with all the fixin's – catered by Corky's along with deserts provided by club members. After the meal, TVP Larry Bean acting as MC for the evening, welcomed all and introduced the first performer.

President Jon Bucher opened with an attempt to pull the proverbial table cloth from under a spread of his wife's Christmas China. Amazingly it worked, to a round of applause – plus a standing ovation from Susan Bucher who had loaned the china. Webmaster Bob Bullock channeled his Italian tomato farmer character to perform a wonderful Benson Bowl style routine with sponge tomatoes. The routine ends with the bowl wondrously overflowing with the ripe sponge tomatoes. Local favorites, Joey Williams and Jimmy Rhodes, teamed up to take the stage next. Joey performed a Silk to Egg routine followed by Jimmy, who did a Card Sword routine using a rubber chicken for a sword and what looked like one of Col. Sanders' chicken buckets. The pair worked in unison for their finale with Joey presenting the "Snowstorm in China." The storm part was provided by Jimmy manning a home leaf blower. Zany and entertaining!

During intermission, Jon Bucher returned to the stage to conduct our perennial favorite quiz contest: pitting a selected group of kids against a group of adults. Of course the quiz was rigged, and the kids proved smarter than the adults, as usual.

Between the acts, MC Larry Bean would attempt to vanish a silk with the aid of a young assistant. When the trick would not work, Larry kept trying with a larger wand. Of course this was the "Bigger Wand" effect, ingeniously staged in steps throughout the show.

The second half was led by the Hensini brothers (Dan Hecke and Jim Henson) who did a great skit on stage to the soundtrack of the old 1950s novelty song. "Beep, beep!" by the Playmates. Dan had created a wonderful cardboard Cadillac and Nash Rambler for the duo to race around the stage. Their antics of course ended with a crash – thankfully off stage.

Paul Carlon followed with a perfect performance of the Anderson Newspaper Tear, much to the delight of the crowd. Illusionist Randall Eller provided the grand finale for the show. He first performed his version of the art pad card rise. He was then joined on stage by his assistant Casey, and together they performed one of the fastest and cleanest "Metamorphosis" routines anybody had ever witnessed.






Derrick Rose
