
Final Estate Sale

The Classics

What makes something a classic? In a lot of people's mind classic means "old" while this has some element of truth it is not all that makes something a classic. Let's take cars for instance a classic would be a 1963 Corvette Stingray however even the newer Corvettes could be considered a classic. Oh, sure they have changed over the years, but the brand is considered a classic. Recently Tony Bennett passed away and as the tributes came in the one thing I kept hearing over and over was he sang the "American Songbook". In other words, he sang the classics. But here is the thing about Tony Bennett he was not stuck in the classic time period, which is evident when he did a recent album with Lady Ga Ga (his second one). So, what can we learn from these classics when it concerns magic?

Let's look at a classic trick called the Linking Rings. If you read old books, you will see a lot of emphasis on the designs you can make with the rings (flower, etc.) and you would also see routines with up to 11 rings. But the basic trick is that you link and unlink rings, over and over. Doesn't sound very exciting, does it? But if you look at a Chris Capehart or Pop Hayden routine with just 3 rings, they are able to keep an audience entertained. So yes, to the classics but no to the "oldness" (is that a word?)

You see the classics are classics for a reason. They have stood the test of time. The sub trunk, zig zag lady, etc. are all illusions that could be considered classics but if you watch a current illusionist perform them you would think they were invented yesterday. Some sub-trunk illusions are so fast that even though I know how it is done I am still amazed.

I have heard several professionals say something to the effect that once they learn the mechanics of the trick they throw away the directions which are filled with "old" patter that usually doesn't fit their style.

If you want a good laugh, go read some of the patter in Tarbell and imagine saying some of those things today, they just wouldn't work.

So, pick a classic and ask yourself the question how could this be more relevant today? Back to the Linking Rings if you read or see Mike Caveney's linking coat hangers you will see how the linking rings dramatically changed but the magic is exactly the same, linking and unlinking coat hangers. Someone has come up with linking and unlinking balloons, ropes, I even heard of someone doing toilet seats.

So get busy studying a classic and then change it.


