

## President's Corner

Good Values (aka Cheapest for good quality)

What is a good value? My wife (Sarah) and I are about to leave for a Caribbean cruise. In my opinion it is the best value in vacationing. The truth is that if you went to fine dining for a week, you would almost pay what a cruise costs. You get a place to stay (although not spacious it serves the purpose), you get to see other parts of the world you would most likely not see (Cozumel - Mexico, Costa Maya - Mexico and Roatan - Honduras) on this particular cruise. - 2. DVD's and (Streaming) While a lot of DVDs and streaming devote themselves to a particular trick or subject there are some that are general in nature and are a great value Reel Magic magazine (which you can still purchase through Mr. Magic or sign up for streaming continues to be a good source of material). I recently stumbled across a version of "Out of this world" called "Out of this blah, blah, blah" that was shown by Jon Armstrong.
  - 3. Magic Magazines If you are a member of the IBM you get the "Linking Ring" every month.
- 4. Auctions I recently purchased one of the estate mystery boxes, and was surprised to find a little gimmick that is not produced anymore but is a takeoff on a (magazine, paperback book) choice and revelation. You're likely to see it in the future.
- 5. However, I love magic props and the best value is still that trick that I have seen and appreciated and want to add to my repertoire. "Mother of all Book Tests" comes to mind (yes, it is a gimmicked book) is it cheap No. Is it a good value yes.

So, what is a good value in Magic? The prop, book, etc. that YOU have received a lot from. Once I read a Barrie Richardson book "Theater of the Mind" I had to have them all.

# Secretary Report

Little Rock Magic Ring 29 met once again at David's Burgers in North Little Rock presided by President Dane Dover. The business portion of the meeting began with Dane talking about how difficult it has been to find a suitable and permanent location for our monthly meetings. A request to everyone was made to keep an eye out for a possible location. In the mean-time, it appears we will be bouncing from location to location until one becomes available.

This was followed by having Secretary Marty Haughn inform the Ring about the upcoming Benefit Show in October. Details included, time, date, location and other details. There is still one performer position to fill with a few possibilities. Ticket sales will be accomplished via Eventbrite through the use of a custom QR Code. The QR Code will be on the website, Facebook and flyers. Paper tickets will also be sold through the membership.

As business was closed Vice President Joel Nicholson Handed out some undisclosed information on sheet of paper. The instructions were not to look at the information on other side. Once all sheets where handed out Joel began his "teach in" of sorts to his Oil and Water which was performed last month. Each step was noted and stated one at a time by each member. At each point in the instructions that required announcement of Red, Black, Red, Black, Red, Black Joel had everyone make the announcement as a group. All said, I think everyone now knows how to, maybe, do this Oil and Water.

One of two visitors from Ring 75 of Ft. Smith, Arkansas, Clyde Hayre began with a quote made by the late Bill Pitts. Bill Pitts was Ring Secretary at the time and reported in the Linking Ring that, "The next performer was Clyde Hayre> He did twenty minutes of his latest ten minute card routine". This occurred sometime in the 70's. At this point Clyde talked about being able to perform magic at a moments notice, say at a party or family gathering. The idea was to use an unprepared deck of cards from the host. It was at this point he removed all the spades from the "borrowed deck". He explains that he has nightmares of magic going wrong and actually takes notes from his nightmares. Clyde proceeds to have a card selected by Larry Bean and has Larry state whether or not the top card is dealt or switched. Eventually, Larry's card was exposed.

Although not a stranger to Ring meetings, member Dr. Chris Westfall attended after a long hiatus. It was great to see him back and se him perform. Dr. Chris was assisted by Janie Nicholson and Tammy Haughn with Historian Mike Curtis on guard duty of a small ring box. Dr. Chris had Janie draw a picture on a card then sign it. Every time the card was placed in the middle of the deck, it always miraculously was found at the top. This occurred several times and on the last go-round, Tammy was asked to push the card into the middle to ensure it was there. To her surprise, once done, she looked up to see the card in dr. Chris' mouth! It was only moments later when the ring box was inspected that the SIGNED CARD that was JUST in his mouth was now folded and in the ring box! Well now, that is what you call a come back to meetings routine! Thank you Dr. Chris!

Mr. Al Henager waltzed up to the front and asked Joel Nicholson to cut the cards from the bottom and look at it. The card was placed in the deck inverted. From here, Al stated that he had gone to Baylor University and asked a drunk to mix the cards. Al commenced to mix the cards like the drunk, slurring his words, by way of flipping a small stack over then another, then another and one more time. The card were thoroughly messed up. Well, when Al "sobered up", the cards were spread on the table only to find Joel's card the only one in the deck face up!

# Secretary Report

After his trick Al handed out some papers. One had information on the AMI, a magic club that is virtual. Al had recently joined and offered the opportunity to attending members to join. He also handed out a sample of a "One Sheet" which had his information and photo on it. He explained their use. Thanks Al.

Secretary Marty Haughn was next in line and presented an early Valentines Day trick. Asking Joel and Janie Nicholson to assist, Marty had been shuffling the cards then split the deck in half. Each half was handed to Joel and Janie to hold. Marty explained that like the funny cards found in magazines like Cosmopolitan one could do a compatibility test, and so he did. The first question asked was by way of the number, secretly count out the month Joel and Janie were married. A verification of each count was made to see if they matched, and did. Second question, by way of number, count out the month your first born child's birthday. When completed Janie's piles were collected then Joel's. Now side by side it was time to look at the top cards they ended up with. Unfortunately, they did not match. From an envelope, Marty removed a "magazine card", which identifies how well the compatibility test went. The three opportunities to be compatible, well, they failed. The cards matched nothing listed. As the final chance, Marty read the back of the card stating how compatible they were, turned the card around to show pictures of their cards.

President Dane Dover spoke of the theme for the evening and stated he too was going to break the rules and not use tarot cards. He began with talking how Tarot Cards were created before playing cards as we know them. Although not using Tarot Cards, he stated one could tell the Past, Present and Future using a deck of cards. Dane first asked Janie to cut into the deck and turn over to reveal her chosen card, the Queen of Diamonds representing the past and gave a sort of reading on the card. Joel was then asked to cut further down and reveal his card, the Jack of Hearts, representing the present. Again, another sort of reading. Finally, Janie was asked to scroll through the deck to the first face-down card which was to represent the future. Before turning the card over Dane gave a short reading on what he thought the card was to be, representing the future. The card was the Eight of Diamonds, just as he had predicted.

Dane closed with a short discussion about card decks and how they could be used, unconventionally, as a reveal card. For example, the Queen of Clubs and Queen of Spades both have what appears to be six spades on their sleeves. This could be used as the six of spades, or if you had a gaff card of the 12 of spades. The black Kings are no different as they sport five spades or ten spades how ever you choose to use them. If you look at the Bicycle 808's Joker you will see six spades and on the Jack of Hearts the four clubs or eight clubs. Looking at the face cards you can find other "revels" one could use.

That is all form Little Rock. Remember to Stay Safe and Stay Magical.

Our August meeting was a special happening, a lecture by one of the funniest magicians this writer has ever watched, Mr. Fielding West. Forty-one members got the word on the upcoming public show and subsequent meetings regarding that gig. Then they got the lecture. Ably introduced by Vice President Tyler Vodehnal, or "Tylenol," as we like to call him, Mr. West elucidated his take and experience of comedy magic. How about bottle productions using the same dove harness? For the sleight-of-hand workers there was coin manipulation and a "Ring Flite" effect with retention vanish. Cigarettes were manipulated and there was a no-gimmick Cigarette Thru Coin. Mr. West's balloon stuff was entertaining and the balloon swallowing bit amazes and amuses the lay audience.

Of particular interest to this writer was Mr. West's comment on comedy: comedy is a story. It has a beginning, a middle, and an end. Amen. I have watched Fielding West perform in Las Vegas and his performance is funny, magical, and entertaining. I laughed my guts out! One of the members of Ring 29 is producing a documentary on the history of the Ring.
